Drawing and Painting: Developing Visual Language

Semester 2 - Tuesday & Thursday - 6:30 – 9pm*

5 ETCS Credits at Level 7

General FAQ

Are materials provided?

Yes. Basic drawing materials. Paper, charcoal, pencils, masking tape. Paints are not provided. You will be advised on what to buy as the course progresses.

What time is the class?

From 6.30pm-9pm. Set up 10 minutes before class.

Where do I specify my night of choice on application?

You need to specify which night you prefer when applying for the course. Enter your preference for Tuesday or Thursday evening in the Additional Information box on application.

Will we be doing portraiture?

Yes, some of the course will focus on drawing portraiture. There will be a model in each class.

How long is the course?

12 weeks contact plus 1 week assessment

I have very little drawing experience. Can I do this course?

It helps to have some drawing background but you will still learn the basics of drawing from the figure.

Will I have to do extra work outside of class?

Projects will be given each week to explore and complete. This is compulsory if you are seeking accreditation at the end of the course.
